I. TDOT 3 year Plan, presented by Dexter Justis, TDOT.

will begin. It was stated a bid letting in late March 2024, then possibly start seeing the beginning process of construction (could be tearing down building close to the railroad tracks) sometime in Summer 2024. No ation is needed on this project.

II. Protect 1 – Resiliency Plans Fall Plans announcement, Carbon Reduction & NEVI Funding presented by Troy Ebbert, TDOT OCT, talked about these three items.

TDOT/AEOM have created this survey to gather feedback on carbon reduction projects and strategies that your members would prefer to see in their communities.

The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) created several new programs, including the Carbon Reduction program (CRP). IIJA is providing \$6.4 billion dollars in formula funding to the Carbon Reduction program, to reduce carbon emissions from the transportation sector.

Tennessee's portion of that funding is approximately \$139 million total, divided over fiscal years 2022 through fiscal years 2026.

This survey is not only to inform your members about the carbon reduction program and eligible project types, but will help us make informed decisions regarding the types of carbon reduction projects your jurisdictions feel would be the most beneficial in their areas. By taking this survey, you are helping TDOT utilize the funding for the types of projects that are important to your communities, the survey.

- IV. Status Update of the 11E Corridor Study in Jefferson City As of Monday, Feb. 20, 2023, there are 406 survey responses. A public meeting was held on April 6, 2023 at the City Hall in Jefferson City. No action is needed at this time.
- III. Status Update of the SR160 Corridor Study in Morristown 634 responses to the survey. Virtual meeting on April 24, 2023. Public meeting at Living Promise Church, 5075 Dearing Road, Morristown, TN 37813 on May 15, 2023 from 5pm to 7 pm. No action is needed at this time.

IV. Program of Projects

Motion to Recommend Approval: The Program of Projects (POP) is a list of projects, for each agency, to be funded with the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5307, 5310, and 5339 funding. FTA requires a public hearing on the POP. Staff had sent out a copy of the letter from TDOT on the FTA 5307 and 5339 funds LAMTPO just received. No action is needed at this time.

V. Information/ Updates from FHWA/ FTA/ TDOT

TDOT Multimodal Grant application is out, if anyone is interested.

TDOT Local Government Guidelines Training is being offered at TDOT Region 1 on May 23-24, 2023. This is a requirement for a local agency wishing to use state and/or federal funds.


Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) What's unique about CRP? 65% of funds apportioned to a state are obligated by population. Meaning all MPOs have been given a pre-determined suballocation. The 4 TMAs have project selection authority within their boundaries. TOD'T developed a survey to help determine what


 35% of funds may be obligated anywhere in the state at the DOT's discretion

 MPO's can program their allocations prior to the states' strategy plan. TDOT developed a survey to help determine what types of project were important to each population category. The survey closed on May 5, 2023. The results from the survey will inform the decision for developing carbon reduction projects.
